11. CONTRIBUTIONS TO TEACHING PRACTICE N/A

The Skills Articulation and Literacy Tool (SALT) is a tool designed to complement disciplinary curriculum by helping students at all levels recognize, articulate and communicate the value of foundational skills: communication, creativity, deliberative skills, growth mindset, integrity, intercultural awareness, problem

transformation, resilience and collaboration. There's a growing recognition of the importance of "foundational skills". These are the "transferable", "essential" or "human" skills acquired in early childhood and honed over the course of a lifetime. Employers, in particular, increasingly often explicitly seek these skills in prospective team members, recognizing their role in creating organisations that are driven by adaptability, innovation, and social and emotional intelligence. SALT consists of:

- (1) a self-paced assessment questionnaire to identify users' current strengths and areas for growth
- (2) a definition of each skills that illustrates what types of behaviours fall in the challenge, learning and flourishing zones
- (3) An step-by-step guide to practice reflection
- (4) option to retake the assessment and continue your reflection regularly
- (5) options to share your results with a designated mentor to deepen your reflection

While the assessment encourages students to think about both personal and work environments, the reflection exercise requires that they situate themselves in contexts where they work with academic or work colleagues (and in doing so, to think of the environment they create for others).

Understanding what foundational skills are and how, when complemented with the relevant technical competencies, they contribute to success in both academic and non-academic settings should be a priority outcome for university and college education, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. The ability to understand and articulate the value of one's foundational skills is what allows graduates to communicate effectively how their education has prepared them, beyond the provision of technical competencies required for a job, to meet employer needs by contributing to the overall success of a workplace.

Innovation, Collaboration and Design in Philosophical Research is a new graduate level seminar developed and introduced to increase the relevance of graduate training in philosophy. The rationale for developing the new course is that in an increasingly complex world, where information is available in overload, tomorrow's thinkers will need the skills to apply design tools and an understanding of systems change to work in interdisciplinary, collaborative team settings while fostering inclusive and innovative solutions. A PhD or an MA in the Humanities is a stepping stone towards a wide range of careers in which social impact and social innovation are desirable outcomes. Graduate students in the Humanities are uniquely positioned to take on projects that address urgent social and human questions and rethink the foundations of human and social experience, whether through their research or other types of knowledge activities. This graduate seminar is designed to fill this critical gap in graduate education in Philosophy, in the Humanities and beyond.

The course introduces cutting edge strategies to enhance research skills, drive impact and broaden your career prospects in academia and beyond. Students:

- Acquire valuable knowledge and professional tools for strategic leadership, communications, collaborations, conflict resolution and EDI
- Learn to work in teams, and acquire tools for effective collaborative and interdisciplinary research
- Acquire the basic tools of consulting
- Learn to articulate and communicate the value of foundational skills such as e.g., critical thinking, creativity, problem-solving they are developing as part of their graduate training and beyond
- Learn to think about institutional complexity and systems to create change
- gain a better understanding of the role of social and human research in social innovation and what that means
- Learn how to apply design processes in research contexts and beyond
- Acquire the theoretical and practical tool to increase the impact of their research

Innovation for Social Impact (offered on an exceptional basis as COMMERCE 4SI3) Co-leading the team developing the instructional material and online collaborative protocols for the delivery of this new experiential course that brings undergraduate and SSH and Business students to learn about social innovation alongside not-for-profit managers. The course is built around a new model of experiential co-learning, that aims to build capacity for social innovation in both current and future NFP managers, strengthening connections between campuses and their communities along the way. The course and instructional resources are being piloted at McMaster in W2022, and Ottawa and Guelph in F2022. Toolkits will be made available open access.
